COVID Vaccine Community Clinic

Q: What should I bring with me?

A: A form of identification if available. If you do not have an ID, that is okay. You do not need to bring any insurance information.

Q: What if I called 806.244.9259 to put my name on the list for a vaccine, will I have to come to this clinic?

A: Yes, as stated from the beginning, this is a continually changing process. Due to the large shipment of vaccines coming, the process has changed to a community-wide clinic. We will no longer be using the call line for vaccine reservations.

Q: How will I get my 2nd vaccine dose?

A: For the Moderna vaccine, there is a MINIMUM of 28 days between doses, and 21 for Pfizer. As more vaccines arrive, vaccine clinics will be scheduled for 2nd doses.

Q: Who should not get the vaccine?

A: If you are pregnant, breastfeeding, have received plasma from a COVID positive person, or under the age of 16.

Q: What if I have questions about if I should get the vaccine?

A: Please consult your healthcare provider before receiving the vaccine.

Q: Where will the vaccine be given and what should I wear?

A: The vaccine will be given in the upper arm, wear a short-sleeve shirt.

Q: What if I am in quarantine but would like the vaccine?

A: You can receive the vaccine two weeks after a positive test. If you are in quarantine please wait until the next vaccine clinic and you are cleared to leave quarantine.
