

Board Engagement






Financial Report Revenue

Financial Report Expenses





C-Arm x-ray machine is a necessary tool in Pain Management Procedures, funded through the Amarillo Area Foundation's discretionary grant and The Don & Sybil Harrington Foundation. Dallam & Hartley County residents have access to pain management procedures close to home.



A new bilirubin meter is advantageous to our newborns and their parents by avoiding unnecessary heel sticks. The physicians want to assure the babies' bilirubin level is not elevated prior to their discharge.
