Requirements

The five courses listed in Semester One – General Education are the required prerequisites needed in order to apply for the Transition track.

The additional general education courses are shown in the position that they must be taken to progress to the next level of Nursing courses. Students must also be at the college level in Math in order to apply.



Students must have Medical Terminology. It can either be the 3-credit hour course of HITT 1305 Medical Terminology or HITT 1205 Medical Terminology as a 2credit hour course. AC offers this course in both Summer 2023 and Fall 2023, as well as Spring 2024, for enrollment consideration. Students will take the HESI (A2) in Spring 2024.
